# Pumpkin, chilli and coconut soup

## Ingredients

- 1 medium pumpkin or butternut squash
- 1 large white onion, chopped
- 2.5cm piece of root ginger, finely chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, finely chopped
- 1/2 scotch bonnet chilli, seeds removed and chopped
- 4-5 sprigs thyme
- 400ml/14fl oz coconut milk
- Sea salt and freshly ground black pepper



## Method

1. Cut the pumpkin in half, then into wedges. Peel and deseed each wedge and cut the pumpkin flesh into 2.5cm cubes.
2. Put the pumpkin in a large pan with the onion, ginger, garlic and chilli. Strip the leaves from the thyme and add to the pan.
3. Pour in about 400ml/14fl oz of water, bring to the boil and cook until the pumpkin has turned to a pulp.
4. Add the coconut milk and season to taste with salt., then reduce the heat and leave the soup to simmer for another 5—10 mins.

## Bonfire Toffee

### Ingredients

- 75g/3oz golden syrup
- 75g/3oz black treacle
- 150g/6oz light soft brown sugar
- 75g/3oz butter
- 1/4tsp cream of tartar

### Method

1. Line a 15 x 20cm baking tray with non-stick baking parchment.
2. Measure all the ingredients into a deep, heavy-based saucepan. Place over a medium heat and stir occasionally until the butter is melted and the sugar has dissolved.
3. When the mixture is smooth and well-combined, increase the heat and bring to a fast boil. When the mixture reaches 140C/285F, pour carefully into the lined tray.
4. Partially cut the toffee into even pieces ( after about 15 mins) with an oiled knife or let the toffee cool completely and break with a toffee hammer. Store in an airtight container

The Lottery which was originally set up in early 2014 to promote and raise awareness in recycling was funded by the Department for Communities and Local Government has now finished, but made 127 winners very pleased.

The Speed Indicating Device has now been used in several locations in and around the villages of Weston and Weston Hills. Some of the data recorded will be provided to the Police so that they can target specific locations and time slots with the aim of bringing prosecutions against speeding motorists. The sheer number of vehicles recorded has been surprising and the speeds recorded of a small percentage of drivers has been truly shocking.

**The next Parish Council meetings will take place on Monday 5th October at Weston Hills and Monday 2nd November at Weston**


As always there will be a 15 minute Open Forum at the start of the meeting for any member of the public to have their say regarding matters which affect them.

## Pet safety On Bonfire Night



### Please do:

-  Keep your pet indoors with windows and doors securely closed.
-  Try to sound proof your house.
-  Ensure your pet has access to a place where they can go and settle if they are distressed.
-  Take your dog for their usual walk before the fireworks are set off and ensure that they are kept on a lead at all times.
-  Ensure your pet is wearing an ID so that if they do run away there is a greater chance of them being returned to you.
-  Praise your pet when they are calm as this will help reassure them.

### Please do not:

-  Take your dog to a fireworks display or walk your pet while fireworks are being set off.
-  Tie your dog up outside if fireworks are being set off.
-  Let your dog off the lead near a bonfire or fireworks display.
-  Leave your pet alone if they are distressed.
-  Shout at your pet if they have been destructive as a result of distress – this will only upset them more.
-  Attempt to comfort your dog – this can make their fear worse. By paying attention to their behaviour when upset we can teach them that fireworks are something they really should be frightened of.



## Help with heating costs: a warmer home for winter

Many of us worry about rising fuel costs, but not heating our homes properly puts us at risk of cold-related illnesses such as a heart attack, a stroke or even hypothermia. If you were born before 6 January 1953 or receive certain benefits, you'll get extra money to help you in winter.

### Winter Fuel Payment

Winter Fuel Payment is an annual payment to help with heating costs, made to households that include someone born before 6 January 1953.

### Can I claim it?

Most people born before 6 January 1953 will qualify for the payment in 2015/16.

In 2014/15 the payments were:

- £200 if you're under 80
- £300 if you're 80 or over.

These amounts will be paid again in winter 2015/16 unless there are changes in the law before then. You'll usually get less if you live with other people who also qualify.

You only need to claim once. After this you should get it automatically each year as long as your circumstances do change.

### How do I claim?

To ask about your payment or to make a claim, call the Winter Fuel Payment helpline on 08459 15 15 15.

Always be accompanied by an adult when you are trick-or-treating.

You should only go to houses of people you know and who are happy for you to call. Don't call at houses that have 'No trick or treat' posters on show. There may be elderly or vulnerable people living at these addresses who do not feel comfortable speaking to strangers.

Stay safe, keep to places that you know and are well lit. Do not take shortcuts through gardens, alleyways or parks.

Watch out for traffic - drivers might not see you.

Never go inside someone's house – only accept treats on the doorstep.

Have fun, but have respect for others and do not damage property.

Know where your children are trick-or-treating. Set a time for children to get back, and make sure you know who they are with. Better still why not go with them.

The Spalding East Rural Policing Community Panel has identified littering in the villages and surrounding areas as a growing concern. To try and combat this issue we have teamed up with South Holland District Council and designed a leaflet which we will be giving out to land workers, villagers and visitors to our area.



## When God Says, ‘No’

Dear Friends,

All of us Christians have had times in life when God says ‘no’ to us. And these ‘no’s’ are never easy to take, especially if we have believed, deep within ourselves, that what we have asked or hoped for is something good and right. Many Christians, when they receive a ‘no’ from God, are so deeply wounded by what they perceive as God’s unfairness that they turn away from God completely. These no’s are hard for all of us whether we are laypersons or

clergy, for they really test our faith.

Scripture, prayerfully read and meditated upon, is for me a great help when I receive a ‘no’ from God. If you have not read it recently, have a look at the book of Job in the Old Testament. Job was a good, upright, and blameless man upon whom all sorts of terrible afflictions fell. He lived in a society that saw afflictions of any sort as punishments meted out by God upon a person for that person’s misdoings. Job, however, knew that he had done nothing to deserve the afflictions that befell him. And he questioned God about this. God did not answer Job’s questions; God simply let Job know that God’s ways are shrouded in mystery. But God did in the end reward Job for his faith, for his not giving up on God despite all the suffering he endured.

There is much for us to think about in this story of Job. There is a lot of suffering that we bring upon ourselves or that is brought upon us by other people. There is also the suffering that comes as a result of natural disasters. And we can and do categorize our suffering as deserved or undeserved. But ultimately we are faced with the question of why both ourselves and the natural world around us undergo suffering. Nature is, after all, ‘red in tooth and claw;’ and there is much wastage of plant and animal life. In the end, therefore, we, like Job, are faced with the mystery of God’s creation. Why is this not a perfect world?

Just as we did not create the world, so we cannot answer that question. We can like Job only trust in the knowledge that God is good. And as Christians we know that God is love. If we can hold on to that fact, if we can prayerfully trust that God, in his love for us, will see us through to new life both in this world and the next, then we can know that suffering and death are not the end. We can know that God’s word for us, although sometimes a ‘no,’ is ultimately a ‘yes.’ As Psalm 30: 5 puts it, ‘Weeping may linger for the night, but joy comes with the morning.’ That joy, that Easter joy that comes to us on account of Jesus’ resurrection, is at the heart of God’s plan for us. May God help us never to lose sight of his joyous ‘yes.’

## The Fireworks Safety Code

- ⇒ Only buy fireworks marked BS 7114
- ⇒ Don't drink alcohol if setting off fireworks
- ⇒ Keep fireworks in a closed box
- ⇒ Follow the instructions on each firework
- ⇒ Light them at arm's length, using a taper
- ⇒ Stand well back
- ⇒ Never go near a firework that has been lit. Even if it hasn't gone off, it could still explode.
- ⇒ Never put fireworks in your pocket or throw them
- ⇒ Always supervise children around fireworks
- ⇒ Light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves
- ⇒ Never give sparklers to children under five
- ⇒ Keep pets indoors
- ⇒ Don't set off noisy fireworks late at night and never after 11pm


