Poacher's Soup!

Method

- saucepan
- 2. Add the vegetables, cover and cook gently for 5 mins taking care not to let them brown.
- 3. Remove from heat
- 4. Add the broken up carcasses, the herbs, peppercorns and stock, reserving a little stock for blending.
- 5. Bring to the boil, cover and simmer for 2 to 3 hrs until the stock is really well flavoured.
- 6. Strain the ingredients and add liquid back to saucepan.
- 7. In a blender, puree the scraps of meat with a little of the stock until smooth, return to the pan with the remaining stock.
- Season and bring to the boil so that the meat is 8. well heated through, stir in the sherry and serve with a swirl of cream in each bowl.

Inaredients

- Carcasses of cooked game/chicken
- Scraps of cooked game/ chicken meat
- 1 tbsp. bacon fat or oil
- 2 med carrots, roughly chopped
- 2 large onions, roughly chopped
- 1 white turnip, roughly chopped
- 1 stick celery, diced
- 1 bay leaf
- Sprig fresh thyme
- 8 peppercorns
- 3 pts veg stock
- 1-2 tbsps. Sherry
- 2 fl oz double cream for serving

Rich Beef Stew!

Method

- Heat the oil in a 1. large saucepan and brown the steak on all sides, add onions and cook for a further 2 mins
- 2. Add the bacon and cook for another 2 mins.
- Remove from the heat and stir in the oatmeal and then add the diced swede and the mushrooms.
- 4. Add the tomato puree and redcurrant jelly, pour in the stock and wine and stir well. Season, return to the heat, bring slowly to simmering point cover and cook slowly for about 1 1/2 to 2 hrs until the meat is tender.
- 5. Check the seasoning before serving.

Ingredients

- 1lb stewing steak cubed
- 1 tbsp. cooking oil
- 1 large onion ,diced
- 4 oz bacon rashers, diced
 - 2 tbsps. Oatmeal
- 1/4 small swede, diced
 - 1/4 lb mushrooms, sliced
- 2 tbsps. Tomato puree
- 1 tsp redcurrant jelly
- 1 pt beef stock
- 5 fl oz red wine
- Salt and pepper

South Holland District Council

At Full Council Meeting in February, members voted in favour of increasing SHDC's part of the 2017/18 Council Tax. The increase of of £5 based on a Band D property, is something which was not taken lightly by Andrew, Anthony, Rodney or other members of the Council, but with less money coming through from Central



Government, in order to continue supplying front line services the Council provides such as weekly refuge and recycling collections, this increase of less than 10p per week is reasonable, especially where other Councils struggle to balance their budgets and not be able to offer services on such frequent basis.

A clampdown on spitting and street drinking in Spalding is proving successful. Spitting, urinating, defecating and littering are all banned under a public spaces protection order in Spalding which was introduced by SHDC and started last December. Otherwise known as a PSPO, the aim is to also tackle anti-social behaviour on the town's streets and is enforceable. The ban covers an area from St Thomas's Road north to West Elloe Avenue and from the east of the railway station to Commercial Road.

On Monday 13th March, The Chairman of the Council and other members joined thousands of people across the globe in raising the flag for Commonwealth Day 2017. The Chairman Michael Seymour raised the Flag and SHDC's Priory Road Offices and then read the affirmation.



Dear Friends,

The only way we can understand Easter is by coming to see that this material world we live in is not all there is, but that there is also a spiritual being that somehow surrounds and permeates the universe, i.e. God. Of all the animals that inhabit this earth we humans alone have been given the capacity to know God. The problem is that we tend to prefer not to try to get to know God. We tend to be pretty self-centred creatures, creatures who like to think

that we know best. That is the reason why most of us only begin to think about God when things go wrong, when we realize that there is a great deal in life that we cannot control. In other words, it is when we feel helpless that most of us, I reckon, begin to think about God. We are like the younger son in Jesus' famous story (Luke 15: 11-32), the son who only after he had squandered all his money and ended up in a terrible situation decided to seek help from his father, not knowing how his father would receive him. The great thing about Jesus' story is that the father received his wayward son with open arms and a celebration. The point Jesus was trying to make is that the father in this story is God, and the younger son is us.

The sad thing is that too many people never find God. As our society does not encourage us to think about God, when life gets out of our control too many of us simply turn to things that will deaden our pain, but not give us any real hope.

Perhaps we need to try to recover that sense of wonder and awe that we had as small children. We become so hardened to thinking solely in terms of what we perceive to be the givens of this material world that we are unable to see beyond it. But when we do begin to think and wonder about questions such as 'What's behind it all?' or 'Why are we here?' or 'Who am 1?,' we are in a position to think about God. We can then begin seriously to think of Jesus, not as just a good man, but as the God-man, the Son of God who came into our world to show us once and for all that God is not just the creator of all that is, but that God is a loving creator, a creator who is always reaching out, even in the worst situations, to give us new life. This is indeed an amazing mystery. And yes, there is pain and suffering in our world: this is the price we and the world pay for our freedom to do as we like. God does not force us to follow his way of love. On the cross we see God himself suffering the cost of this freedom given to us. But then on Easter God shows us that death does not have to be the end. Easter shows us that in his immeasurable love for us God offers us not only new life in this world, but new life after we die.

Just as love between two people is something that cannot be scientifically measured or proven, so the love God has for us and the love we can come to feel for God cannot be scientifically measured or proven. But the vast majority of us know that love exists. Love is not something you prove; it is simply something you experience. So why not let yourself be attracted to believing in God's love? Finding faith in God gives life a meaning that cannot be equalled, for it is a meaning based on the fact that love is from God, who, having created us on account of his love for us, wants to give us new life both now and for ever.

because in this month cows would be milked three times a day!
May Queens would be chosen to celebrate Spring and Flora.

14th May—The Hiring Fair

This was the traditional day when Farm Workers were hired, they would attend the local 'Hiring Fair' to seek employment. Some would carry their tools of trade to the hiring fair as an indication of the work they were looking for, if selected the farmer would give them a shilling—this was known as a fastening penny and if the shilling accepted a deal was struck. Boston continues this tradition with its annual May Fair.



Maypole Dancing -the dance is performed by pairs of boys and girls who stand alternately around the base of the pole, each holding the end of a ribbon. They weave in and around each other, boys going one way and girls going the other and the ribbons are woven together around the pole until the merrymakers meet at the base. Dances are performed

every Mayday around the permanent Maypoles . Some temporary Maypoles are usually erected on village greens and events are often supervised by local Morris dancing groups.





Chesnut Sunday took place on the second Sunday in May when the Horse chestnut Tree was in blossom. The event was celebrated by the Quakers in memory of 'The Pilgrim Fathers' who fled to Holland to escape persecution and then to America on 'The Mayflower'.

<u>Jennifer Saunders</u>—born in **Sleaford** on July 6th 1958, She attended the Central School of Speech and Drama where she met Dawn French. She began her career at The Comedy Store in London.

Jim Broadbent was born in Holton cum Beckering, in Lincolnshire, the second son of Doreen "Dee" Broadbent, a sculptor, and Roy Laverick Broadbent, an artist, sculptor, interior designer and furniture maker. Broadbent's parents were both amateur actors who co-founded the Holton Players acting



troupe at Holton cum Beckering. He had a twin sister who died at birth. Broadbent was educated at Leighton Park School, a Quaker school in Reading, and briefly attended art college before transferring to the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art from which he graduated in 1972.



Margaret Thatcher was born Margaret Hilda Roberts on 13 October 1925, in Grantham, Lincolnshire. Her father was Alfred Roberts, originally from Northamptonshire, and her mother was Beatrice Ethel from Lincolnshire. She spent her childhood in Grantham, where her father owned two grocery shops.

Isaac Newton was born according to the Julian calendar (in use in England at the time) on Christmas Day, 25 Dec 1642 "an hour or two after midnight", at Woolsthorpe Manor in Woolsthorpe-by-Colsterworth, Lincolnshire. His father, also named Isaac Newton, had died three months before. Born prematurely, he was a small child; his mother Hannah Ayscough reportedly said that he could have fit inside a quart mug. He was an English mathematician, astronomer, and physicist (described in his own day as a "natural philosopher") who is widely recognised as one of

the most influential scientists of all time and a key figure in the scientific revolution. His book *Philosophiæ Naturalis Principia Mathematica* ("Mathematical Principles of Natural Philosophy"), first published in 1687, laid the foundations of classical mechanics.



Eric Chappell (born 1933, Grantham, Lincolnshire) is an English comedy writer

So perfect an Early Gothic interior is rare Over the last few years work has been done to the roof , a recent inspection says the tower is in need of some repair amounting to £ 60 000 . We would hope that some grants are available but will have to raise money ourselves. The attendance at church is small and it will be impossible for them to raise the money without help. This architecturally is the most important building in the village, being Grade 1 listed. Are there enough people who want to see this building looked after, and in good repair, so that it will still be here in the years ahead? There has been a church of some description on this site for around 800 years.
