

Your SHDC Ward Councillors have used all their Designated Ward Budget for the current period of Administration, with the last amounts going towards a permanent beacon and planning applications for new bus shelters in Weston, a new door for school and bowls mats and equipment in Weston Hills, and supporting the flower festival and Friends of the School in Cowbit. Over the years, we



have been happy to be able to offer financial assistance through our Ward Budgets to support many organisations and projects mainly within our ward, but at times outside where there is a direct link to residents in our electorate.

Andrew, Anthony and Rodney were delighted that planning was refused for the development on the site what became known as the "ski-slope" on Roman Road, Moulton Chapel. This long ongoing saga, which has been continually and repeatedly objected to by your Ward Councillors was refused unanimously by SHDC Planning Committee at it's February meeting. Albeit, the site being in a neighbouring parish, we would like to extend our sincere thanks to residents who also objected to this application. This shows a clear message that community spirit, combined with solid reasons for refusal in planning law works effectively.

Community groups who provide warm spaces will be able to benefit from a grant after SHDC won money from the National Grid - Community Matters Fund to support groups providing this service. The council is making a £500 one-off contribution available to those who have signed up to the district's Warm Spaces directory. Those who have signed up but are open less than once a week will be eligible to apply for a one-off contribution of £250.














The Extra Mile is no ordinary sports memoir. But Kevin Sinfield is no ordinary sportsman. A one-club legend of Leeds Rhinos, who has now crossed codes as a defence coach for the England national rugby union team, Kevin Sinfield is a rugby

icon. But in recent years has shown heroism of a very different kind through his selfless and extraordinary fundraising for motor neurone disease (MND), the terminal illness that has affected his best mate and former teammate Rob Burrow. Sinfield's epic challenges have included running 7 ultra marathons in 7 days, and running over 101 miles in 24 hours. In the process, Sinfield has captured the hearts of the nation and over £7 million for MND. He was awarded an OBE in the Queen's Birthday honours for his efforts, along with the Freedom of Leeds and a special BBC Award for his fundraising.

The Extra Mile is the story of an astonishing life, of an enduring friendship, of perseverance against the most difficult of challenges, and of a remarkable, humble human being who has defied the odds. It leaves the reader with the urgent question: Who would you go the extra mile for to help in life?





One Pan Lamb

Method

- 1. Take the lamb out of the fridge 1 hr before cooking it and use a sharp knife to make small incisions all over the meat. Mix the oil with the oregano, chopped rosemary and lemon zest. Rub the marinade all over the lamb, massaging it well into the cuts.
- 2. Heat oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Put garlic, chilli, potatoes, fennel and remaining rosemary into a large roasting tin, pour over some olive oil and toss together. Season the lamb, then lay it on top of the veg. Roast for 45 mins until the lamb is starting to brown, then pour in the wine and stock. Continue cooking for 45 mins.
- 3. Remove the lamb and rest for 30 mins. Turn oven to 160C/ 140C fan/gas 3, cover veg with foil and, while the lamb rests, put back in the oven until braised in the roasting juices. Scatter the fennel over the veg, place the lamb back on top and bring the whole tin to serve.



Ingredients

- 1.6kg bone-in leg of lamb
- 50ml olive oil
- 3 oregano sprigs, leaves picked ,roughly chopped
- 4 rosemary sprigs, leaves of 2 picked ,roughly chopped
- 1 lemon, zested
- 1 garlic bulb, cloves lightly smashed
- 1 red chilli, pierced
- 1kg potatoes, skins on, cut into thick wedges
- 3 fennel bulbs, cut into quarters lengthways, tops removed, green fronds reserved
- 250ml white wine
- 250ml chicken stock

taking place in early May.



Our curriculum is supported by regular topic focus days, trips and specialist visitors that bring learning to life. This term, as part of their 'enchanted woodland' science topic, our Key Stage 1 Cherry and Oak Classes visited Perlethorpe Education Centre near

Newark. They learned about animals and explored their natural habitats.



As part of our Religious Education work we have been looking at Thankfulness. As part of their learning the children in Oak Class thought about how they could give gifts rather than say thank you for gifts. The children decided they would draw pictures and make cards for the residents of Holbeach Hospital. There was also a picture for the hospital staff room; the child who made it said she wanted her picture to be for the people who work there and look after everyone.

Music plays a very important part in our life at school. The benefits of music education to children in schools are wide ranging and include developing cognitive and listening skills, improving coordination and increasing confidence and self-esteem. This term we had a 'Musician in Residence' day when all of the classes in our school took part in a 'Louder than Life' Taiko drumming workshop. The specialist teacher shared the skill of feeling the spirit of the music to remain tranquil and calm. It looked and sounded fantastic and was much enjoyed by all of the children.



We are always delighted to celebrate World Book Day in March and this year we did things a little differently to make sure that the focus was on developing a love of reading and making sure that every single child in our school starts or continues to build their own personal library of books. On the day, each class made a short trip to Spalding to visit the bookshop Bookmark and also the library. At Bookmark, the children were able to exchange their World Book Day £1 book tokens for one of the specially published World Book Day books or use it towards the purchase of another book. At the library the children enjoyed a story or two. Back in school we ran a book swap with children bringing in books from home that they no longer wanted and exchanging them for a token. Tokens could then be exchanged for another book in the book swap. This was a great way to encourage Reading for Pleasure both in school and at home.




