
Welcome to the **Dec/Jan** edition of the Elloe Oracle.

As we approach the festive season, Andrew and Anthony will be involved in some local Christmas events. This first will involve Anthony, who, with local volunteers, will be hosting a Christmas Carol Service at Weston Hills Church on Sunday 7th December 3pm. Tea, coffee and mince pies will be available to enjoy after the service, as well as the draw of the Christmas raffle, with proceeds going to Weston Hills Church. Then immediately, after the Christmas and New Year festivities, on Saturday 3rd January 10am - 12pm, Andrew will host the monthly coffee morning at All Saints Church, Moulton. Not only will this give the usual volunteers a well earned rest, it will also raise money, which will be split between Moulton Park and Moulton Community Association. Thank you to the committee of All Saints for allowing this event to take place. If anyone wishes to donate a cake or savouries such as sausage rolls, they will be greatly appreciated. We hope you can attend either or both these events. Just before Ayscoughfee Gardens played host to it's annual Remembrance event in early November, restoration work costing £205,000 was completed and unveiled of the Grade I listed War Memorial – also know as the Lutyens memorial, named after architect Edward Lutyens. Work included the cleaning of the stonework, replacement of roof tiles, repair of ceil-ing and cornice cracks, installation of new skirting and flooring, repointing and the meticulous restoration of the memorial panels. This follows on from further restoration works last year, including structural render analysis and the installation of a new perimeter French drain and tanking system to protect the monument from water damage. Now back to it's former glory, these important works help secure the long-term preservation of one of South Holland's most treasured landmarks and memorials.

The fight still continues against proposals for possibly 2 large National Grid sub-stations in Weston Marsh and other associated projects such as Meridian Solar Farm. Special thanks go to *Jenny Pennington* for continuing to raise awareness of the potential catastrophic damage that could happen to our local area, landscape and prime agricultural land. **We're with you Jenny!** With this being the Christmas and New Year edition, we would like to wish you all a very Happy and Peaceful Christmas and Prosperous New Year. 




















Ramsden, Yorkshire, 1916.

Leftover Christmas Dinner Pie

Overcatered but don't want to waste good food? Don't fancy another turkey curry? Or just want a super easy dish that can be thrown together in the blink of an eye with bits you already have? Our Leftover Christmas Dinner Pie recipe could be just what you are looking for!

Ingredients

- 1 tbsp olive or vegetable oil
- Knob of butter
- 1 large onion, sliced
- 2 tsps readymade mustard
- 50gms plain flour
- 150mls white wine
- 500mls chicken stock of leftover gravy
- 6 leftover sausages (these could be leftover pigs in blankets), cut into bite sized chunks
- 200gms stuffing, cut into bite sized chunks
- 300gms cooked turkey, shredded
- 100gms crème fraiche or double cream
- 800gms leftover roast potatoes
- 50gms grated cheese



Method

- 1. Pre-heat the oven to 200oC/gas mark 6
- 2. In a large, shallow casserole dish, heat the oil and butter and then add onion. Cook for about 10 minutes over a medium heat until it is really soft.
- 3. Stir the mustard, flour and stock cube into the onion mixture and cook for 1 2 minutes until everything starts to thicken before adding the white wine and stock or gravy. Allow this to bubble for about 5 mins so that you have a lovely, smooth sauce.
- 4. Add the sausages, stuffing, turkey and crème fraiche or double cream to the sauce and stir well to combine all of the ingredients.
- 5. Crumble up the leftover roast potatoes and scatter them over the top of the filling and then sprinkle over the grated cheese. Pop into the oven and bake for about 40 minutes until the potatoes are crisp and the filling is bubbling around the edges.
 6. Enjoy with salad, crusty bread and a glass of something delicious.

Hi Everyone

First of all can I on behalf of the Council wish every resident a happy Christmas & a healthy New Year. A few updates from my previous messages, firstly the ongoing complaints regarding speeding within our villages, some suggestions have been sent to Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership (LRSP) to combat speeding on Austendyke Road and the High Rd in Weston and we await a response. Secondly, the Zip Wire which is part of our play equipment has now been installed at Weston Park with further infrastructure coming in the new year. With regards to speeding vehicles we understand that speed surveys

have been carried out on both the High Rd in Weston and Austendyke Road and we are awaiting the results from Highways. I sent an email to the Enforcement Officer of LRSP when they suggested some of the problems with speeding on Austendyke Road was down to anomalies with our speed detection device, something in my response I disagreed with. I have offered LRSP a meeting on site at Austendyke Road to discuss any remedies we can agree on to keep this road safe and speeds down. I am still waiting for a response. It has become clear over the past months that we have outgrown the room we are allocated at Weston Village Hall for our meetings. The number of residents attending meetings has increased and after a debate at November's meeting it was decided to move the bi-monthly meetings to the Community Centre on the High Rd. This allows for more residents to attend including the Annual Open Meetings and is located on the High Rd, Weston near to the "narrowing" road calming measure just before the Chequers Public house. The Council has for many years worked alongside the Village Hall Committee and will continue to do so, but we feel there is the need for a more appropriate location in order to conduct our business. At our October meeting we met with a delegate from Meridian and met behind closed doors for a Q&A session and without fear of contradiction little was really gained from what we already knew, however councillors did put some strong questions to the delegate who agreed to get back to us in due course, however to date we have received no response. As the clocks went back recently we have now altered the opening times of the Weston Park gates to 0700 to 1700.

We have had a busy few months here in the summer in Weston Marsh with back to back consultations running for the various energy projects that are due to hit the area. Of course. also, land surveys, all sorts of ecological and wildlife surveys have been going on for 3

years and more recently some of you will have see the CCTV cameras that were put up for a few days in the Weston Marsh and Weston areas. We are expecting National Grid to disclose the location of the sites of the two new substations together with interconnecting pylons shortly and, by the time you read this, we may know of the consultation dates. Even if you are not directly affected by these proposals, there will be a huge impact on the area with large parcels of agricultural land being taken of production both permanently and temporarily while the infrastructure is being built. Traffic hold-ups and delays on routes for us all while we go on with our normal lives. Some of you may not know where Weston Marsh is but one of the substations will be seen from the A151 at Weston, with the Weston area becoming an industrialised one. If anyone fancies a ride over the border into Norfolk, take a trip to Walpole and West Walton and see what has happened there over the last few years and with even projects more planned! THIS IS WHATWILL HAPPEN TO WESTON MARSH AND WESTON! Ooh did I forget to remind you about the two converter stations that are planned with the Ossian Wind Farm? And the Weston Marsh to East Leicestershire route of pylons which are due to go to consultation in 2026? Please spare some time to go along to any consultation dates and see the proposals. It doesn't take long to send an email or even a letter with the comments to the project developers. Most or all of these projects will happen but they do listen to you and who knows your comment could be pertinent to their planning! Please help us to save our area from mass destruction. 
